

John White

The very personable John White, now 38, was the "senior citizen" of squash's top echelon toward the end of his Tour career — and still is a tough test in any match — anywhere — for any opponent.

John broke into the PSA Top 100 in 1994 and cracked the Top 50 a year later. He was into the Top 20 by 1998 and the Top 10 in 1999. He was a fixture near the top of the list for many years and for a time in 2004, he owned the distinction of being No. 1 in the world! John has the PSA Masters title under his belt as well as a stellar roster of major semifinal and final results. The big right-hander also holds the Guinness World Record for fastest recorded squash ball speed; a backhand drive recorded at 172 mph!

Born and raised in Australia where his parents owned a squash club, John was something of a nomad setting up housekeeping (and his squash headquarters) in Belgium, Holland and Nottingham, England before making the big jump across the big ocean to the U.S. His first full time stop was the Philadelphia area where he was the travelling pro for a club in Wilmington. The area seemed to fit as John recently spent three

highly regarded seasons as the Head Coach of the Franklin and Marshall College squash program in Lancaster, PA before being lured this past summer to his current position as Head Coach of the Drexel University program in Philadelphia.

Change has followed John. An early "big switch" saw him adopt his father's birthplace, Scotland, as his new squash "home country." He competed internationally for Scotland for much of the prime of his career.

Married to an American, John and Susie White have four hard chargin' young children who are certain to soon be a fixture at the many events John continues to play throughout the USA.

With his humorous approach, affable nature and amazing skills, John remains a crowd favorite whenever he competes.

Peter Nicol

Peter Nicol's career in squash is legendary. Winner of every major PSA title, including the World Open, British Open, US Open and Tournament of Champions, often more than once, and four Commonwealth Games Gold Medals, Peter's claim to Hall of Fame status is assured and recognized. Perhaps his most indelible mark on the world of squash from the mid 1990s to the mid 2000s was his incredible run of 60 months as World No. 1.


The 37-year-old, born in Inverurie, Scotland, shuttles between his hometown Aberdeen, London and America as he pursues his passion for the sport both on and off court. Founder of Eventis Sports Marketing which presents the annual Canary Wharf Classic and other squash events, the Nicol Champions Academy for senior and junior squash training and Legends of Squash, Peter is perhaps busier now than as a pro tour player!

In his 12 year pro career, Peter reached 66 Tour finals and won 48 of them. His rivalry with Jonathon Power alone remains legendary as the two contested 43 PSA World Tour matches, many of them major finals, ending up 22-21 in Peter's favor.

His supreme achievements in squash were recognized in a very distinctive manner in 1999. He was awarded an MBE (Member of the British Empire) by Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth, the only male in squash ever so honored other than Jonah Barrington, one of the most respected icons in the sport of squash.

Martin Heath

37-year-old Martin Heath was born in Stirling, Scotland. His 'home town' is the coastal town of Oban in the Western Highlands - one of Scotland's most idyllic tourist destinations, but when he was not at one of the PSA Tour stops he split his time between Scotland and North America.

Martin won 7 titles during his PSA career and was in 8 other finals. He has 10 semifinal finishes and 20 quarter finals.

He made his professional debut in 1993, appearing for the first time in the January PSA world rankings at No. 251. In September 1996 he made the big jump into the top 20, leaping from No. 29 to No. 19. However, it wasn't until 1998 that Heath made his debut in the top 10 at No.7 by reaching the final of the Al Ahram International, beating World No.1 Peter Nicol in the semi-finals. At the time, the Al Ahram event was the largest purse to date at \$175,000. In 1999 Heath reached the semi-finals of the World Open, losing to eventual champion Peter Nicol 3-1. In 2000, he finished runner-up at the Tournament of Champions in New York City, beating Peter

Nicol in the semi-finals, before losing to Jonathon Power in the final.

Since retiring as a player in 2004, Martin has worked as a coach and sports journalist, writing a column for Squash Magazine and commentating on many PSA tour events as color and lead commentator. He is currently the Head Squash Coach for the University of Rochester men's varsity squash team, the "Yellowjackets". Heath led the team from a pre-season intercollegiate (CSA) ranking of No.28 in 2005 to No.3 in 2009. The Yellowjackets reached the semi-finals of the CSA National Championships in 2009, 2010 & 2011.

Martin also coached the US Junior Men's Team from 2007-2011, leading the team in Switzerland in 2008, India in 2009 and Ecuador in 2010. Heath was honored for his work with the National Team and his success with the University of Rochester by being named US Olympic Committee National Coach of the Year 2010.

The son of a basketball player and semi-professional footballer, Martin took up squash at age eight. He graduated from Glasgow University with a BSc in Physiology, Psychology and Sports Science. He is married to Canadian Fenella Rawana and has a 3 year old son, Kamren Heath, both residing in Toronto, Canada.

Jonathon Power

North America's best-ever pro squash player, Jonathon Power, was a fixture on the PSA Tour computer for 15 years. He retired as No. 1 in 2006, not long after winning the rich Saudi International, his 37th career championship.

The feisty Canadian had held the No. 1 spot for much of 1999 and four months in 2001 and was near the top of the list for most of his career as a pro - never out of the Top Ten for his final six years on the Tour.

Jonathon won virtually every major title in squash at least once including the World Open, the British Open, Qatar, Hong Kong, the US Open, the Tournament of Champions, the Canadian Open and the Commonwealth Games.

He started 2005, his last full year on the Tour, by taking the Apawamis Open title. He also won the Bermuda Masters, took Super Series Finals in May and won his 36th PSA Tour title -- the Motor City Open in Detroit.

Jonathon started his final tour year, 2006, by making the final of his 'home' tournament, the Canadian Squash Classic (aka Canadian Open). He breezed to the championship match

where he faced No. 2 ranked, old friend Amr Shabana. Midway through the first game he had to take an injury timeout when his back began to spasm. He gamely struggled on to finish the match -- but lost all three games and his chance for a fourth title in the Canadian event.

He was later quoted as saying he carried on to finish the match through the back pain – not wanting to disappoint the large, loyal crowd on hand for what he thought might be his last major final match.

His final tournament was the 2006 Tournament of Champions in New York, where he announced his retirement from the Tour. He came close to winning a 38th career title in the previous event, the Windy City Open, defeating Amr Shabana in the semifinals but losing a scintillating five game final to Aussie veteran David Palmer.

The 38-year-old Canadian, who lives in Toronto, has thrown all his energies behind a new Canadian National Squash Centre in the city. Partnering with fellow squash standout Gary Waite and local pro Jamie Nichols, Jonathon is overseeing the build out of the largest squash-exclusive facility in the country with eight glassback courts, one all glass singles court with seating for 500 and the first-of-its-kind all glass hardball doubles court, all built by McWil Courtwall the leader in glass squash court technology.

Jonathon and Sita Power are the proud parents of a bubbling five year old girl named Parker.

Former World No. 1 Peter Nicol continued his dominance of the new Legends of Squash Tour by edging past longtime rival John White 11/13, 14/12, 11/9, 12/10 in the final of the \$30,000 Maryland Club Legends yesterday in Baltimore, Maryland. Playing in front of a packed audience surrounding the two-sided glass court at the club, it was White that set the pace early with furious, slashing blasts for the nick that connected more often than not and pulled him in to the early lead. Nicol, however, has added offense to his traditional tireless all-court retrieval skills and used of mix of both to climb back in to the match in the second. Whether it is the sheer fun of returning to court against old friends and opponents or a renewed athletic enthusiasm borne from realizing that they both "still have it", White and Nicol traded exhausting, delightful, magical rallies for more than 50 minutes before the Aberdeen-based Englishman Nicol put away the Lancaster, PA-based Aussie Scot White 3-1.

In round robin play Nicol defeated David Evans 11/13, 11/7, 11/5 before firming up his game to top longtime nemesis Jonathon Power 13/11, 11/9 in another packed-out crowd pleaser. In the other pool, White defeated Simon Parke 13-11, 12-10 and overcame a stellar Martin Heath 6/11, 11/6, 11/9 to reach the final. Rounding out the pool matches, Power beat Evans 11/3, 11/4 and Heath beat Parke 11/4, 11/9. Heath earned Third Place honours 2/0 over Power.



Throughout its colorful seven-year history (2003-10, with a one-year hiatus in 2009 since Baltimore hosted the U. S. National Doubles that season), the Maryland Club Open, partly as a consequence of its annual mid-October positioning at or near the beginning of the squash season, has had an out-sized influence on the dynamics of the ISDA Tour, even to the point of in several instances serving to redefine the entire competitive landscape by undoing the established pecking order and ushering in an entirely different and significantly transformed era. Perhaps inspired by the impressive trappings of the host club and/or the rich history of doubles squash in Baltimore (which has hosted the prestigious U. S. National Doubles no fewer than 11 times, most recently in 2010, and whose annual BIDS invitational doubles event had for decades been a highlight of the amateur schedule), ISDA players have in disproportionate numbers taken their games to new levels and produced some of the most exciting matches and unexpected outcomes in the history of the Association.

This phenomenon began with a bang in the very first main-draw match of the inaugural edition of this tournament, on Halloween night in 2003, when Blair Horler and Clive Leach, regarded as the hottest team on the circuit after they had emphatically closed out the prior season by bullying long-time No. 1's Gary Waite and Damien Mudge into submission in the Kellner Cup finals, were shockingly eliminated, in straight sets no less, by qualifiers Alex Pavulans and Chris Deratnay, who after a pair of 15-12 games rallied from 3-9 and 7-11 to force a simultaneous-game-ball in the third, at which crossroads stage Horler crushed a backhand rail into the tin. Somewhat demoralized by this harsh beginning to a season in which some thought they might even displace Waite and Mudge at the top of the ISDA standings, Horler and Leach staggered through an uneven autumn, and, just as they were showing signs of regaining their verve in January, Horler sustained what would prove to be a career-ending injury to his right knee, effectively sidelining him for the remainder of that season and freeing Waite and Mudge (who would capture both that '03 Maryland Club Open and the '04 and '05 events as well, defeating Michael Pirnak/Willie Hosey, Josh McDonald/Viktor Berg and Preston Quick/Ben Gould in, in each case 3-0, in those respective finals) to continue their hold on the No. 1 team ranking for several additional years.

But if it was in Baltimore, as we have seen, that the Waite/Mudge dynasty would sustain itself throughout the first half of the decade of the 2000's, it would also be in this same

Charm City site that it would be rudely brought to an end when they fell in four games to Gould and Paul Price in the semifinals in 2006. Gould and Price were one second-game simultaneous-game-ball from facing a two-games-to-love deficit, but when Price seized that crucial 16-all point by coming up with a look-away forehand roll-corner that paralyzed Waite, the Price/Gould tandem was on its way, not only in that match (which they terminated with a pair of single-figure games) or that weekend (which they finished off with a four-game final-round win over Quick and John Russell), but for the entire season, during which Price and Gould out-played Waite/Mudge in three-straight subsequent finals — namely the Big Apple Open, North American Open and Briggs Cup — wrested the No. 1 team ranking at last from its seven-year captivity with Waite/Mudge and elbowed Waite into retirement at the end of that 2006-07 season.

But it is its own tribute to the breadth and reach of the Waite/Mudge tenure at the top that the reign of Price and Gould seemed so ephemeral. Just one year after hoisting the Maryland Club Open trophy and dethroning The Champs, Price and Gould returned to Eager Street in the fall of 2007 still reeling from having squandered a 2-0, 14-9 lead eight days earlier in a St. Louis semi against Leach and Chris Walker, who went on to win that match in five games and the final against Mudge and Hosey as well. Price and Gould would get their chance at revenge in the Maryland Club Open final, and indeed would lead 2-1, 11-8, just four points from a successful defense of their 2006 title, only to suffer yet another late-match drought against the same pair of Englishmen, who rescued that fourth game with a 7-1 run that carried them through the 15-11 fifth as well. By the end of that match, Price and Gould were reduced to taking their anger out on their respective racquets — Gould hurled his 40 feet to the front wall after his tin at 9-13 effectively sealed his team's impending defeat, while Price smashed his in the small alcove right outside the exhibition court, an action that was clearly audible to the gallery since the door at the back wall was still open, where it lay in splintered shards for several hours before finally being collected by a janitor.

This pair of consecutive-week collapses would presage the end of the Price/Gould stint at No. 1, at least for several years, as they were displaced first by Walker and Leach when the next rankings were published a few weeks later, and then by Mudge and Berg (who would hold that spot for the next two years) at midseason. Two aspects of the foregoing



discussion are compellingly noteworthy: first, that all three of these Maryland Club Open "game-changers" were by the narrowest of margins — had Horler's backhand blast at 0-2 14-all in '03 stayed above the tin, it surely would have won the point (Deratnay was stuck in mid-court near the tee), giving Horler/Leach both that third game and possibly a degree of momentum that might have swept them to ultimate victory; had Price not successfully engineered his nervy and barely-above-the-tin shot at 0-1, 16-all in '06, his team would have been down two games to love against Waite/Mudge and the whole match might have been different from that point onwards; and had Price and Gould been able to convert their substantial four-point late-game advantage in '07, they would have reduced their prior week's St. Louis misadventure into a one-time fluke and hence into irrelevancy. So many of the important moments in ISDA competition have come down to a few swings of the racquet, a roll or two of the dice.

A second, and truly historically important, point is that there have been 45 full-ranking ISDA tournaments since that October '07 Maryland Club Open final (47 if one counts the sanctioned though non-ranking biennial World Doubles of 2009 and 2011 in San Francisco and Toronto respectively), and ALL of them have been won by teams of which either Mudge or Gould was a member! The last 12 of those events, the 12 that comprised the 2010-11 ISDA circuit, had BOTH Mudge and Gould as members, as their decision during the summer of 2010 to partner up after their several preceding years as fierce rivals resulted to an immaculate 12-for-12 38-0 ledger that makes them, until proven otherwise, the team to beat entering both this weekend's Maryland Club Open and the 2011-12 ISDA Tour as well.

Significantly, no fewer than six of those dauntless dozen Mudge/Gould titles came at the final-round expense of one or the other of the two other teams in this weekend's round-robin Pro Doubles competition. Matt Jenson and Leach were finalists in the Big Apple Open, Boston, Greenwich and Players Championship events, while Walker and his British compatriot Mark Chaloner advanced to the final in Wilmington and at Brooklyn Heights. All told, either Jenson, Leach, Chaloner or Walker opposed Mudge/Gould in nine of those 12 finals last season, a testament both to the strength of this weekend's three-team field and to the wisdom of the host club's Tournament Committee and its longtime head pro Andrew Cordova, who throughout this tourney's history has shown a willingness to maximize its





value to the Maryland Club membership by "changing things up" and offering a variety of innovations from one year to the next. These creative elements have included different prize-money and draw-size formats (including a decision to pay teams that reach the last round of the qualifying draw, something no other ISDA tour stop had done), altering the way the highly-subscribed Pro-Am portion of the tournament was played and the introduction of a "Legends" pro singles draw for retired elite PSA players last year.


That latter group found themselves so drawn throughout that weekend to the ISDA doubles matches — one player almost missed his flight back to Europe by tarrying far longer in the doubles gallery than he should have — and consisted of players several of whom themselves are so accomplished in doubles, that all four of this year's Legends (Peter Nicol, 2000 Cambridge Doubles winner Jonathon Power, 2003 Cambridge Club Doubles champion Martin Heath and 2009 U. S. Pro semifinalist John White) will be joining the six ISDA players comprising the three round-robin teams and another six top-tier ISDA players (Russell, Quick, Greg Park, James Hewitt, Jonny Smith and Manek Mathur) in what should be a captivating 16-team Pro-Am event, yet another innovation that will undoubtedly further enrich the proud legacy of the Maryland Club Open.

Rob Dinerman has written the team profiles and major articles for every Maryland Club Open Program in the history of this tournament and his "History Of The U. S. National Doubles In Baltimore" was the feature article in the National Doubles Program when that event was hosted in Baltimore in March 2010. The winner of two pro-am events, the Mitch Jennings Cup and Tim Chilton Cup, in 2009-10 (with Chris Walker and Ed Chilton as his respective partners), and a U. S. Hardball Nationals finalist in 2004 and 2005, he is currently Editor of a squash web site, dailysquashreport.com, and recently released a Memoir, "Chasing The Lion: An Unresolved Journey Through The Phillips Exeter Academy," excerpts of which can be found on his web site, www.RobDinerman.com.

2010 Maryland Club Open ISDA QUALIFIER DRAW





2011 MARYLAND CLUB OPEN PROFILES BY ROB DINERMAN

Damien Mudge/Ben Gould: Completely fulfilling (indeed exceeding) all the preseason hype that attended their decision to partner up during the summer of 2010 after several years of fierce rivalry, this prepossessing pair of Australian gunslingers compiled a perfect wire-to-wire record in which they dominated the 2010-11 WPSA Tour by going 12 for 12 and going undefeated in their 38 matches. This remarkable run began, of course, with a season-opening triumph at the 2010 Maryland Club Open, where after falling behind Chris Walker and Mark Chaloner 1-0, 7-4, in their very first match, Gould and Mudge, who had never been teammates prior to last season, proceeded to blast through the remainder of that quarterfinal match and to record straight-set victories over first James Hewitt and Greg Park in their semi and then John Russell and Preston Quick in the final. Mudge and Gould would be forced to five games only twice all last season, in each case rallying from two games to love down, first against Russell and Quick (who in fact led 14-11 in the fourth game of a St. Louis semifinal only two weeks after Baltimore) and then in the season-ending World Doubles in early May, where in the final Mudge and Gould overtook Clive Leach and Russell, winning both the fourth and fifth games in single figures to close out the first undefeated ISDA campaign in the six years since Mudge and Gary Waite accomplished the feat for the third and final time in 2004-05.

The Waite/Mudge duo won the first three editions of the Maryland Club Open (2003-05) before Gould and Paul Price captured this title in 2006 and 2008, defeating Russell/Quick in each of those finals. The tournament, which was not played in 2009 due to Baltimore hosting the U. S. National Doubles later that season, was won by Leach and Chris Walker the only other time it was held, in 2007, when that pair of British-born stars first straight-gamed Mudge and Viktor Berg and then rallied from two games to one down to out-last Price and Gould in what has turned out to have been the last ranking ISDA event, FORTY-FIVE of which have taken place since that October 2007 weekend, in which neither Mudge nor Gould wound up in the winner's circle. As noted, BOTH of them found themselves hoisting the championship trophy at the end of every ISDA event last season, and, until proven otherwise, they have fully earned the right to be considered the team to beat entering the current campaign.

Matt Jenson/Clive Leach: Undeservedly overlooked in the wake of the unstoppable (and unblemished) Damien Mudge/Ben Gould surge through the 2010-11 ISDA schedule, this pair, now entering their fourth season as partners (a tour-leading figure among top-tier teams now that Preston Quick and John Russell amicably parted ways last spring after five praiseworthy seasons together), quietly but inexorably put together an impressive season themselves, one with enough bright spots (most notably the six finals each attained, four together and two each with other partners) to have enabled them to emerge from the rest of the pursuing pack as the No. 2-ranked team and as such the biggest threat to the Mudge/Gould supremacy.

In moving through the bottom half of the draws at the early-November Big Apple Open, mid-January Boston Invitational and North American Open (the only time all season that the same team opposed Mudge/Gould in two consecutive finals) and mid-April Players Championship, Jenson and Leach moved indisputably past the Russell/Quick tandem by beating them on consecutive mid-winter Saturdays. Jenson also reached two additional finals (in Toronto with Quick and in Cleveland with Willie Hosey) as did Leach, who has now earned his way into at least two finals in each of the past 10 seasons, 31 finals in all (six of them victorious), including last season not only his four with Jenson but the Philadelphia Country Club event with Paul Price and the biennial World Doubles with his British compatriot Russell.

Chris Walker/Mark Chaloner: This pair of decorated longtime PSA top-10s and teammates on English squads that won World and European Team Championships enter the forthcoming campaign still riding the major momentum of a 2010-11 second-half spurt that saw them go 10-1 against teams other than Damien Mudge/Ben Gould (their conquerors last season in Baltimore, Wilmington, Boston, Brooklyn and Long Island), an impressive tally that includes two final-round advances (in Wilmington and Brooklyn) keyed by a combined 3-0 mark against the Matt Jenson/Clive Leach and John Russell/Preston Quick pairings. Those were the first two career full-ranking ISDA finals for former PSA President Chaloner, who has, however, teamed up in title runs first in Cambridge '01 with Gary Waite (when that event employed a format teaming a PSA player with an ISDA player) and then the Wilmington Challenger '09 with Walker in a memorable final between debuting teams in which Yvain Badan and Jonny Smith led two games to love, and later 10-6 in the fourth, before Walker/Chaloner forced the issue to a simultaneous-championship-point resolution that Walker commandeered with a spiked forehand reverse-corner volley that a diving Smith was barely unable to track down.

Prior to their teaming up a few years ago, Walker amassed four ISDA full-ranking titles --- the '06 Cleveland and '07 Denver events with Viktor Berg, with whom Walker also reached the North American Open and Kellner Cup finals in the winter/spring of 2006, and the October '07 tour stops in St. Louis and Baltimore with Clive Leach, Walker's partner in a run to the '08 Cambridge Club final as well ---- while Chaloner, in addition to his aforementioned exploits with Waite in 2001 in Toronto, had an outstanding run with Willie Hosey during the 2008-09 season featuring three combined wins over the Jenson/Leach and Russell/Quick teams en route to semifinal advances in St. Louis and Brooklyn and a third-place finish in the Cambridge Club Doubles.

National Championships in hardball singles (2011), softball singles (2003 and 2004) and doubles (2003 and 2004 with Eric Vlcek and 2007 with John Russell)...Also teamed with Russell to reach 14 ISDA finals during their five-year (2006-2011) partnership...Recently appointed U. S. Squash Director Of Doubles with the exclusive mandate to administer and grow the doubles game in the United States.

John Russell: Winner of two ISDA titles, the 2007 U. S. Nationals with Preston Quick and the Cambridge Club Doubles with Viktor Berg last season...Reached Maryland Club Open finals with Quick in 2006, 2008 and 2010 defeating Chris Walker/Berg; Damien Mudge/Berg and Matt Jenson/Clive Leach in those respective semis...A former PSA top-50 singles player who was on the English squad that won the World Junior Team title in 1996.

James Hewitt: A four-time semifinalist in ISDA full-ranking play last season (including the Maryland Club Open) and three-time finalist in Challenger events...He and wife Steph, a top player on the WDSA women's pro doubles tour, have won the Canadian Mixed Doubles each of the past three years...Co-founder (with Gary Waite) in 2000 of the ISDA, which he continues to serve as Executive Director, he was Tournament Chair of the highly successful World Doubles in Toronto this past spring.


Greg Park: The only American in the ISDA top-15 other than Preston Quick, whom Park partnered to the semis of the 2011 World Doubles with wins over first Martin Heath/Greg McArthur and then just-ensconced Canadian National Doubles champs Michael Pirnak/Willie Hosey...Received the ISDA Rookie Of The Year Award for 2010 at the World Squash Awards ceremony in New York this past January...Partnered his father Steve to the U. S. Father & Son title for three straight years from 2007-09.

Jonny Smith: A full-ranking semifinalist with James Hewitt in Cleveland in 2009, Yvain Badan at the Kellner Cup in 2010 and Mark Chaloner at the World Doubles in 2011, he won the Pittsburgh Cup Challenger tourney last season with Raj Nanda...Has been the head pro at the Union Club in New York since the summer of 2008...A former British Junior No. 1 who is one of four Trinity College alumni (Preston Quick, Badan and Manek Mathur are the others) ranked in the ISDA top-13.

Manek Mathur: Stunned the squash world last October when he and Yvain Badan, in their debut appearance as partners, engineered consecutive upset wins over first Matt Jenson/Clive Leach and then Paul Price/Raj Nanda to reach the final...Contributed a key 3-2 win to Trinity College's pulsating 2009 Potter Cup 5-4 final-round victory over Princeton after competing for India in the 2006 World Junior Championships...At age 23, he is easily the youngest player in the ISDA top-12 and indeed the only member of that dauntless dozen not to have reached his 30th birthday.




